Jubilee Park Redevelopment	\$35m	Indoor facility at Jubilee Park will feature: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Six multipurpose indoor courts, including a 1,000 seat show court - Elite training facilities for multiple sports - Female-friendly change rooms and a creche for players and spectators - State-of-the-art cafe, community meeting and function rooms
Lloyd Park Pavilion	\$6.5M	Boasting sweeping views of the main oval (oval 1) and across to ovals 2 and 3, the upgrade at Lloyd Park will include new car parking, extended pavement for pedestrians and the demolition and rebuild of a new pavilion. The new pavilion will feature: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Four change rooms with amenities for men and women -Two umpires rooms -Canteen/Kiosk -Public toilets -Two first aid rooms -Storage -Accessible lift -Social room and meeting room -Kitchen -Toilets The almost \$6.5 million upgrade is fully funded thanks to a \$3 million contribution from the Federal Government and \$3,488,626 million from Council.
Eric Bell Pavilion	\$6.5M	The Eric Bell Pavilion in Frankston North will explore opportunities to provide: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Female-friendly change rooms to cater for growth in women’s sport -Community social room -Meeting room -Change room -Storage -Public toilets -Kiosk - Umpires rooms -First aid room and office on the ground floor. Public toilets will also be located within the new pavilion to cater for all park users In consultation with the relevant stakeholders a schematic design has been completed to construct a new 2 storey pavilion (demolish the existing). Discussions are still underway amongst stakeholders to finalise the design.
Frankston Hospital	\$605M	The Victorian Government is providing \$562 million to redevelop and expand Frankston Hospital. The redevelopment will deliver a multi-level tower with capacity for an additional 120 beds and new operating theatres. A new main entrance will support better wayfinding for patients and visitors. Construction of the acute services tower will consolidate and enhance inpatient services and provide dedicated space for mental health services and a new oncology ward. It will also deliver expanded women’s and children’s services. These will include a new maternity ward, obstetrics ward, women’s clinic, paediatric ward and special care nursery.
Horizon Apartments	\$45M	The Horizon Apartments development, located in Plowman Place Frankston will house 71 apartments across nine levels with bayside views of Port Phillip Bay.

		This large development will provide opportunities for local businesses including maintenance contracts that will be presented.
Major Road Projects Victoria	Various	<p>The MRPV will present three major road upgrades in the South East.</p> <p>Lathams Road Upgrade, Carrum Downs This upgrade will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -upgrade the intersection at Frankston-Dandenong Road -provide a right turn lane at Levida, Titan, Brett and Tova Drive -widen the existing roundabouts at Oliphant Way and Frankston Gardens Drive -install new traffic lights at the Stephensons Road and Colemans Road intersections -build a new bridge over the Peninsula Link, adding a new lane in each direction over the freeway -build new shared walking and cycling paths -install safety barriers along the road. <p>Golf Links Road, Frankston South This upgrade will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -improve the road surface -improve the six-way roundabout at Golf Links, Grant, Warrandyte and Baxter-Tooradin Road -improve the intersections at McClelland Drive and Peninsula Link off-ramp -install traffic lights at the Baxter-Tooradin Road pedestrian crossing near the school -install new footpaths at the southern approach of the six-way roundabout at Golf Links, Grant, Warrandyte and Baxter-Tooradin Road -improve the footpath on Golf Links Road, from Garden Brae Court and Warrandyte Road -add safety barriers along sections of the road. <p>Pound Road West, Dandenong South The project will build a new bridge over the Cranbourne rail line to remove the dead ends at Remington Drive and Pound Road West. The bridge will provide a second connection between Abbots Road and South Gippsland Highway, improving access to the freeway network and reducing travel times for businesses.</p>
Mentone Life Saving Club Project	\$13.5m	<p>Located at 66 Bay Trail, Mentone. A new state of the art Life Saving Club building, situated right on the foreshore of Mentone Bay. Includes major landscaping and parking area.</p> <p>The Project will be under contract to a Principal Building Contractor who will manage the Civil and Building delivery. Subcontractors and trades will be managed directly by the Principal Building Contractor. . Experience in working in a coastal environment is essential in participating in this project.</p>
Moorabbin Airport Master Plan 2021		<p>The Moorabbin Airport Master Plan 2021 establishes a clear vision for aviation and non-aviation activities at the Airport from 2021 to 2041.</p> <p>The positive contribution of the site to the City of Kingston and our region is evidenced by increasing flight student numbers, employment generation and investment. A premium business park, retail and commercial precincts continue to be delivered with quality infrastructure, welcoming landscaped green zones and sustainable design.</p> <p>The Moorabbin Airport is an important activity centre for employment, investment and business services. WJ Crowe Pavilion Redevelopment, Dandenong.	\$5.2m	This project will see construction of a new female friendly sports pavilion which will include: Four unisex payers change rooms, two unisex referee change rooms, male/female & accessible toilets, multipurpose room to seat 150 people, commercial kitchen and kiosks, dedicated storerooms, first aid rooms.
Keysborough South Community Hub	TBA	The construction of the Keysborough South Community Hub will see: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Outdoor community / play spaces -Community meeting rooms -Kindergarten rooms -Child care rooms -Maternal and Child Health consulting suites -Community lounge -Reception, kitchen, amenities etc.
Flinders Community Hub	\$4.5m	The Flinders Community Hub has been designed as a complete demolition and rebuild of the existing Civic Hall. The design reflects feedback from user groups and community as well as considerations from specialist consultants. The Flinders Community Hub design features: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Main Hall with elevated stage and storage area - Offset space divided from the main hall using an operable wall with ability to connect to the outdoor areas. - Large terrace area - Rear storage with loading dock and dry change room areas - Kitchen with dual servery - Two multipurpose Meeting /Art rooms which can expand into one larger room - Toilet amenities including unisex accessible toilet and an Adult Changing Places Cubicle
Southern Peninsula Youth Hub	\$9.0M	The project encompasses a multi-use and fit-for-purpose new Youth Hub that will be co-located on an existing sporting and civic site on Besgrove Street Rosebud, servicing the Southern Peninsula region and incorporating a strong focus on youth mental health. The project will deliver an accessible youth-friendly facility with an innovative design to promote greater utilisation, maximise occupancy and enable a full suite of youth services, including but not limited to: Art and craft space; Break-out lounge; Classrooms; Clinical support services (including Headspace operation); Cooking activities; Drop-in centre; Employment and education assistance; Games and recreational space; Holiday programs; IT Hub; Meeting rooms and work spaces.
